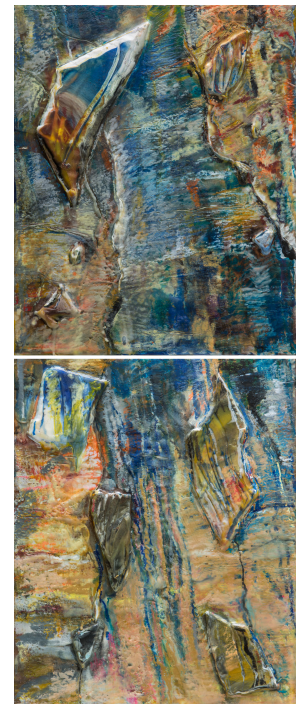
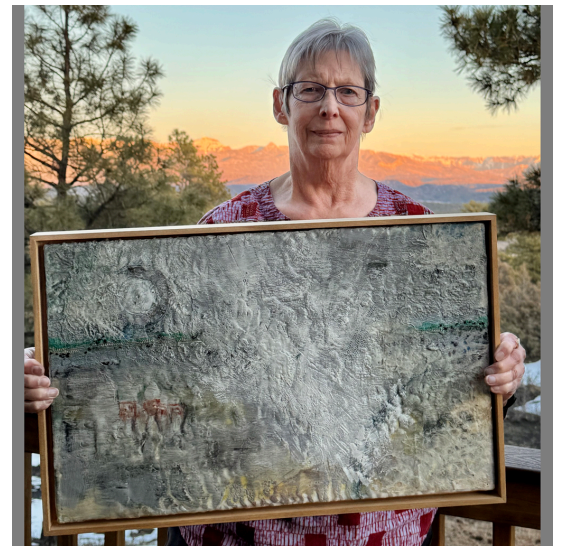
Each new work has a voice of its own. She is the tool that expresses that voice.
